Scholarship Description

Marshall Scholarships finance young Americans of high ability to study for a degree in the United Kingdom. Up to forty Scholars are selected each year to study at graduate level at an UK institution in any field of study.

The Marshall Scholarship awards University fees, cost of living expenses, annual book grant, thesis grant, research and daily travel grants, fares to and from the United States and, where applicable, a contribution towards the support of a dependent spouse. A Marshall Scholarship extends for two academic years (approx. 22 months), but may be extended by the Commission, though not beyond the end of a third academic year.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- Be a citizen of the United States of America (at the time they apply for a scholarship);
- (By the time they take up their scholarship, i.e. September 2011) the student must hold their first undergraduate degree from an accredited four-year college or university in the United States;
- Have obtained a grade point average of not less than 3.7 (or A-) on their undergraduate degree. (Exceptions will be considered only on the specific recommendation of the sponsoring college);
- Have graduated from their first undergraduate college or university after April 2007 and;
- Not have studied for, or hold a degree or degree-equivalent qualification from, a British University.

- Four recommendations (through the online system)

Submission Process

Candidates fill out the form and submit it online, and it is sent to the faculty representative. A university committee ensures that the application is complete and decides whether or not to endorse it. If the committee decides to endorse the application they will add the letter of endorsement and submit the application through the system to the appropriate regional committee.

All items, including the four letters of recommendation, must be submitted online by the faculty representative and received at the regional centre no later than October 1, 2010. Academic transcripts must be sent by mail (not online) to the regional centre, and should be marked with the ID code given and be received no later than October 1, 2010.

Applications will be received and reviewed at eight regional centers in the United States. Short listed candidates will be called for interview in November. The final selection will be announced shortly after interview.
