General Howard University Eligibility Requirements*

- One – year residency at Howard University.
- Sophomore or Junior standing required at the time of application.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 at the time of application.

*Programs may have additional requirements; students are responsible for reviewing those requirements and ensuring their eligibility.

Application Requirements

- Recent Passport size (2”x 2”) photograph. Digital download will not be accepted.
- Official transcript, forwarded or hand delivered in a sealed envelope to the Ralph J. Bunche International Affairs Center.
- Completed course approval form for study abroad (located online)
- Program application (programs may have additional application components that should be submitted with the application)
- All course work must be taken on a “for credit” basis. Courses should not be taken as “audit” or “pass-fail.”
