

Florence Bonner Appointed Sr. Vice President For Research And Compliance

President Sidney A. Ribeau, Ph.D., is pleased to announce the appointment of Florence B. Bonner, Ph.D., as Sr. Vice President for Research and Compliance, effective immediately. She has been acting in the position since July 2008. Prior to that, she served as Associate Vice President for Research and Compliance.

Bonner is a professor of Behavioral Sciences and served as chair of the Department of Sociology and Anthropology from 1992 to 2007. She is also founder and director of the African-American Women's Institute and the Women Studies Program at Howard and served as co-chair on the development of the Strategic Framework I (SFI) and co-coordinator for the social, behavioral and economic sciences in the development of SFII.

Bonner also served as Senior Fellow at the National Science Foundation and currently serves on the Academy of Sciences Committee on Women in Science, Engineering and Medicine.

Before coming to Howard, Bonner was the executive director for the Center for Women in Government at the State University of New York at Albany for seven years. Since arriving at Howard, she has received grants from various federal agencies and foundations. These include the National Science Foundation, National Institutes of Health and the National Cancer Institute; and the Ford Foundation. She currently holds grants from the National Institute of Justice and National Science Foundation.
