

**THE WALTER AND THEODORA DANIEL ENDOWED
EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH FUND**
SCHOOL OF EDUCATION, HOWARD UNIVERSITY

Though the generosity of Walter and Theodora Daniel, an endowed educational fund has been established for the purpose of providing small grants to incumbent or retired faculty, staff members, and students of Howard University. These awards support significant research studies on Afro-American education.¹ Funds are also given for special research programs or support of conferences dealing with research or research-related problems aimed at the improvement of Afro-American education. While the endowed fund is designed primarily to support faculty, staff, and students in the field of education, individuals in other disciplines may apply for assistance to study a significant educational issue. Funds will be awarded for no longer than a 12-month period, beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2011. Unexpended funds may not be carried over after the end of the grant year. The maximum amount of funds that may be requested, per application, is \$5,000. Award recipients are expected to submit a midyear progress report and a final report no later than 60 days after the expiration of the grant. All proposals are reviewed by the Walter and Theodora Daniel Educational Research Fund Oversight Committee.

Applications:

A copy of the application for the Fund can be obtained from the Howard University's School of Education's webpage.

Applicant requirements include an electronic submission of the following:

1. Grant application cover sheet with the applicant's name, department, project title, abstract, amount requested, and other relevant information (*research advisor's signature required for students*)
2. The proposal (6-page, double-spaced maximum) containing purpose, rationale, methodology, and relevance to the body of knowledge on the education of Afro-Americans;
3. A time-frame for conducting the research;
4. Evidence of IRB approval, if applicable;
5. An itemized budget showing a listing of expenditures with justification (if additional funds are needed to ensure completion of the project, please specify other sources of support)
6. Letters of support from participating groups and organizations (e.g., schools, departments, and outside agencies);
7. The applicant's current vitae (two-page maximum).

Submission Deadline:

Completed applications are due electronically, to the Daniel Oversight Committee Vice Chair, School of Education, at vthomas@howard.edu, no later than midnight on September 4, 2010. The original cover sheet with appropriate signatures as well as letters of support, if applicable, should be copied as a pdf file and submitted along with the Word copy of the application. The subject line in the email should clearly state Daniel Application 2010. Questions may be directed to vthomas@howard.edu
