PHILOSOPHY

The Howard University School of Education Early Learning Program (HUEL) provides an academically rich, developmentally appropriate environment, which allows young children an opportunity to enhance their social-emotional, physical, and cognitive growth. The atmosphere encourages children to develop positive self-concept, identity, confidence, and independence. It is our belief that children learn best through hands-on activities that promote choices and active learning. We believe that a climate that fosters respect for cultural diversity and a learning environment that utilizes an eclectic approach to education allow for optimal growth and development of young children.

GOALS

- To maintain a comfortable environment that will motivate learning.
 - To provide multicultural education and foster respect and appreciation for diversity.
 - To encourage individual creativity.
 - To improve and expand the child's natural ability to think, problem solve, and speak clearly.
 - To foster and protect the child's physical health and safety.
 - To assist in the development of each child's emotional and social skills by encouraging self-confidence, self-expression, self-discipline, and curiosity.
 - To provide parents with an understanding of developmentally appropriate practices.

ENROLLMENT POLICY

The Program enrolls children 3 - 6 years of age. Selection of children for admission is based on the number of slots available for HU Employees, HU Students, and the extended Community, the order in which the application is received, and the assessment/orientation interview.

ACADEMIC YEAR PROGRAM

Classes

The core program is between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Breakfast is served at 8:30 a.m. Various enrichment activities are scheduled for the afternoon beginning at 3:30 p.m. At no additional charge, children can arrive as early as 7:30 a.m. and be picked up no later than 5:45 p.m. However, no child should be left at school for more than 9.5 hours (HUEL Policy).

Tuition is due on the tenth day of each month, beginning in August of the year of enrollment.

An application form and a non-refundable \$25.00 fee are required for placement. A separate form and fee are required for each child. It is the parent's responsibility to keep the office informed of any change in information included on the form.

Calendar
